Scripture

EASTER SUNDAY

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"

Our Bible story today tells us about Pentecost, a time when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit in our lives, as well as the birthday of the church. Before beginning today's activity, gather in a circle and answer these questions together: what are some ways your family, or community, celebrates birthdays? What is one fun memory you have of your birthday or someone else's birthday?

Celebrations like birthdays help us mark the passage of time together and unite communities around a common goal, theme, or idea. Today, we will throw a Pentecost Party in honor of the church's birth! Individually, or in small groups, make birthday party decorations out of paper. You could create posters, make paper snowflakes, put together paper chains, make tissue paper pom-poms whatever brings you joy! Make sure to add some color with markers or colored pencils. As you're working, draw pictures of your favorite church memories: Bible study class, church meals, singing together, etc. What makes your church community special to you? Afterward, hang the decorations around your space. Then, put on some music, sing, and have a silly dance party!

If you have time, consider making birthday bags for one another and for members of your congregation. You could include small amounts of candy and snacks, a written prayer, a note of encouragement, stickers, and other items you think community members would enjoy. Distribute the bags the next time you gather together!

Alternate Activity

Materials:

Have you ever thought about how every single person, from every culture and country, has a birthday?

What a cool thing to share in common with every person in the world! While we all share birthdays in common, people often celebrate them differently depending on where they live. Today, let's try out some birthday traditions from around the world:

- · In Australia, children eat 'fairy bread' on their birthdays, a slice of bread with butter covered in candy sprinkles. If food allergies allow, make this snack and try it together!
- · In Denmark, the birthday person is greeted with the phrase, "Gefeliciteerd!" which means, "Congratulations!" Practice saying this phrase to one another! Note: It is easiest to look up how to pronounce Gefeliciteerd online, but one phonetic spelling is Ghe-fu-lu- si- teert.
- In Egypt, birthday celebrations often include decorations made of flowers and fruit. Gather flowers outside, or make paper flowers to decorate your space. Have a snack of fruit, if food allergies allow.

What other birthday traditions does your group enjoy? Does anyone celebrate birthdays with a tradition from another country or culture?






Prayer

J. This is the story of Pentecost—the birth of the church. Happy birthday, Church!


